Our Mission

Florence Crittenton Services of Colorado (FloCrit) educates, prepares, and empowers teen mothers and their children through a trauma-responsive, two-generation model that integrates education, early childhood development, health and wellness, housing stability, and economic mobility.

Beginning this year, FloCrit's Annual Report shows impact and financials on a fiscal-year basis (July 1–June 30) to better align program outcomes and funding cycles.

Who We Serve

FloCrit supports pregnant and parenting teens ages 14–21 enrolled at Florence Crittenton High School, along with alum parents up to age 26.

In FY2025

- 47% were high school students; 53% were alumni
- 44% of parents spoke Spanish (Spanish-only or bilingual)
- Families primarily lived in Denver, Adams, Arapahoe, and Jefferson counties
- Average parent age: 20

Our community reflects diverse racial and ethnic identities, with a majority identifying as Hispanic/Latina, Black/African American, American Indian/Alaska Native, or multiracial.

Education & Early Childhood

Education is the cornerstone of FloCrit's two-generation model.

In FY2025


- 100% of age-ready children were kindergarten ready
- 84% of ECE Center children present for at least two GOLD checkpoint assessments showed growth in all areas.

On campus, students accessed health care, and wraparound supports through partnerships with Denver Public Schools and Denver Health.

FloCrit's **Early Childhood Education Center**, rated **four stars** by **Colorado Shines**, supports children from infancy through preschool, enabling parents to remain enrolled in school while their children build a strong foundation for kindergarten readiness.

Clinical, Parenting, & Transitions Support

FloCrit's bilingual clinical and parenting services strengthen emotional well-being and family relationships.



Through the Transitions Program, alumni received post-secondary, workforce, and resource navigation support, with **37% pursuing education or training** and **46% of those seeking employment securing jobs.**

Wraparound Support & Housing Stability

FloCrit's Student & Family Support Program provides trauma-informed case management across family services, housing, clinical care, and transitions.

In FY2025

- 500 food boxes distributed and 1,300+ Lyft rides provided to support access to school, work, and appointments
 - 86 legal clinic sessions served 42 families
- 79% of parents accessed essential needs with FloCrit support

Housing Outcomes

Housing stability remains the most significant driver of educational persistence and family well-being.

FloCrit measures success through academic completion, housing stability, health and wellness indicators, and family economic progress, using program data, assessments, and participant feedback.

Financial Snapshot (Audited)

In FY2025

- FY2025 Change in Net Assets: +\$320,317 (year-end surplus)
 - Total Operating Revenue: \$7.29M
- 83% of expenses supported direct program services

FloCrit ended FY2025 with a **positive change in net assets**, reflecting strong financial stewardship, disciplined use of resources, and long-term sustainability. Strategic investments and reserves continue to support future priorities, including expanded housing and workforce pathways for teen-led families.

Gratitude to FloCrit's Supporters

FloCrit's impact is made possible through the partnership of individual donors, foundations, government agencies, and corporate supporters.

In FY2025, support included

- 31% Foundations and Institutions
 - 18% Individual Giving
 - 42% Program Service Fees
- \$2.6M in in-kind support, primarily through Denver Public Schools

We are grateful to every partner investing in the futures of teen parents and their children. Together we are creating communities that break the cycle of poverty and empower two generations of young people to thrive.

A Stable Foundation for the Future



When Nevaeh experienced ongoing housing instability, staying focused on school while parenting felt increasingly out of reach. Through FloCrit's Student & Family Support Program, she connected with housing specialists who helped her secure permanent supportive housing through a community partnership. With a safe, stable place to live, Nevaeh was able to re-center on her education, attend school consistently, and plan for life after graduation. She graduated in 2025 and is exploring post-secondary opportunities. Nevaeh's experience reflects the power of FloCrit's integrated approach—when housing stability, education, and trusted relationships come together, teen parents can build lasting pathways for themselves and their children.

Guided by youth voice and community insight, FloCrit continues to strengthen the bridge from education to housing stability and workforce opportunity—creating lasting returns for families and the broader community.
